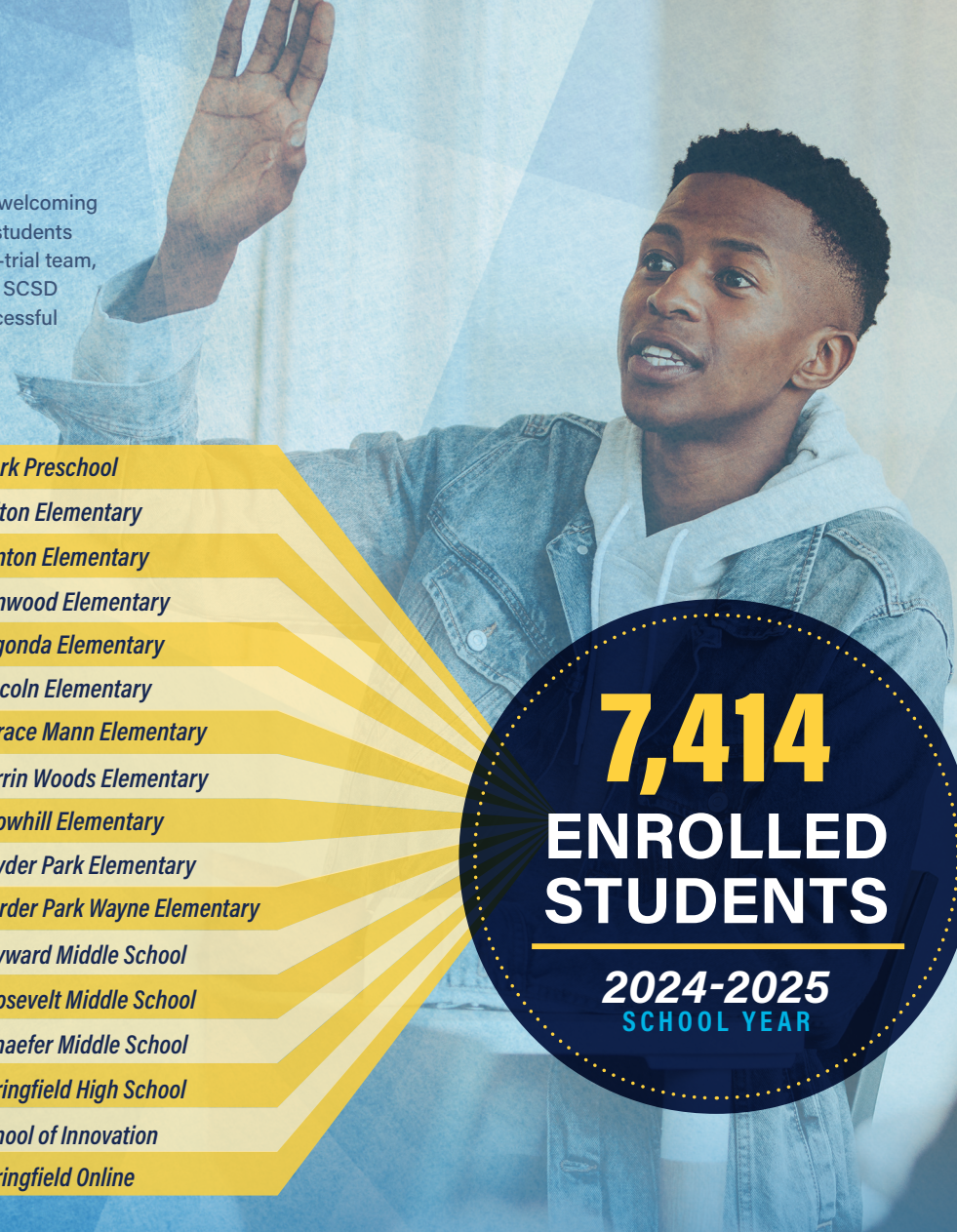

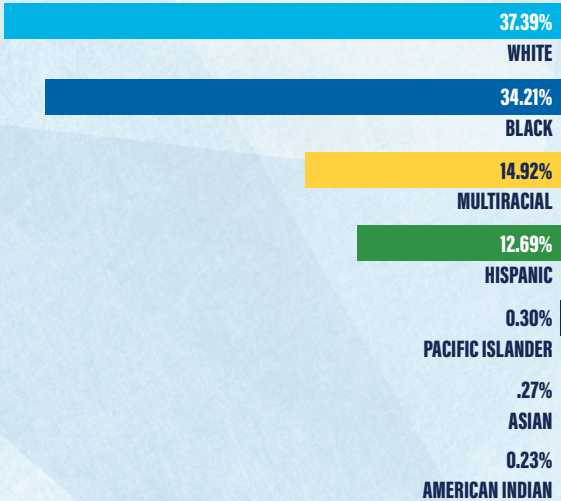
About Our Students
